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## **Boil Water Notice January 4, 2022**

On Friday December 31, we noticed a leak that got gradually worse causing low pressure within Airport Pump station service, on Indian Trail and Rolling Meadows. We began emergency line repair on Monday, January 3 to bore under Airport Rd and put in new line service. This required Blackland Water to temporarily shut down pump stations late on Monday night. Out of precautionary measures with shut down and the reduced pressure that occurred when the repair was made, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality has required Blackland Water Supply Corporation to notify all customers connected to the Airport Pump Station to boil their water prior to consumption (e.g., washing hands/face, brushing teeth, drinking, etc). Children, seniors, and persons with weakened immune systems are particularly vulnerable to harmful bacteria, and all customers should follow these instructions.

Only Blackland WSC customers that are north of I-30 are affected. This includes Blackland WSC customers on Airport Road, Indian Trail, Amity Lane, FM3549, Hillside, the Rolling Meadows Neighborhood, Riding Club Road, Sparks Lane, north side of I-30 and the Buena Vista Mobile home park. Customers South of I-30 are not affected and are not included in this notice.

The repairs have been made and the lines have been flushed. However, you will need to boil the water as this notice instructs until we are able to rescind this notice.

To ensure destruction of all harmful bacteria and other microbes, water for drinking, cooking, and ice making should be boiled and cooled prior to use for drinking water or human consumption purposes. **The water should be brought to a vigorous rolling boil and then boiled for two minutes and cooled prior to consumption.**

In lieu of boiling, individuals may purchase bottled water or obtain water from some other suitable source for drinking water or human consumption purposes.

When it is no longer necessary to boil the water, the public water system officials will notify customers that the water is safe for drinking water or human consumption purposes.

Once the boil water notice is no longer in effect, the public water system will issue a notice to customers that rescinds the boil water notice in a manner similar to this notice.

Please share this information with all the other people who drink this water, especially those who may not have received this notice directly (for example, people in apartments, nursing homes, schools, and businesses). You can do this by posting this notice in a public place or distributing copies by hand or mail.
